**Industrial Action - Teachers**

You may be aware from the media that one of the national teaching unions, the NEU, announced yesterday that their members have voted to take industrial action. This action, commonly known as strike action, will be happening on four dates across February and March as follows:

- Wednesday 1 February 2023
- Thursday 2 March 2023
- Wednesday 15 March 2023.
- Thursday 16 March 2023

The NEU statement about this is:

*The ballot is a result of failure by the Secretary of State in England and the employers in Wales to ensure enough money is available to pay a fully-funded increase in pay for teachers which at least matches inflation, and which begins to restore lost pay.*

While the **exact impact** of the strikes on our school is not yet known for certain, I am keen to advise you of the dates so you can make contingency plans just in case your child's class is impacted by the strike. Due to the nature of the rules around strike action, it is unlikely that the school will be able to give you very much notice about any closed classes or changes to the usual school provision.

We are currently working with the staff to make preparations and we will communicate information to you as soon as we are able to. **Please note - currently, I do not believe that any of our classes will be affected but I know that this could change.**

#### Before and After School Wraparound Care

Before and After School Care fees are charged to your child's parentpay account. **Please ensure these balances are fully paid by the end of each month** or if you are now paying via any of the nursery voucher schemes please let us know so that we can allocate your funds to your child's parentpay account. For next month, all bills **MUST** be cleared by February Half Term please.

#### Wear your Scarf to School day!

On Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February we will be joining in with Wear your Scarf to School day. This is in support of Children's Mental Health Week. Children are invited to wear a favourite scarf or snood all day in school. Our School Council would like to raise funds to buy some more "Little People, Big Dreams" books, which would fit in with the SCARF theme of Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience and Friendship, so we are asking for a small donation in exchange for wearing your scarf.

We will also hold a cake sale after school and will be running a free "Guess the length of the scarf" competition. We have been gifted a special scarf, which will be displayed in a large jar, and invite children to play the game. The child whose guess is nearest to the actual length of the scarf will win the scarf!

#### Advice for parents and carers on common winter bugs and viruses

With lots of common winter bugs and viruses circulating at the moment, the NHS in Gloucestershire, including the Paediatric consultant team, has developed advice for parents and carers of children to help care for them at home or know when health advice may be needed.

There is understandable concern amongst the public following reports of children and young people with Strep A or Scarlet Fever going on to develop serious illness. However, health leaders are reassuring people that Scarlet Fever is usually a very mild illness that can be easily treated with antibiotics, and it is very rare for children to go on to develop the more serious illness known as invasive group A strep (iGAS).
